II. PARENT ENGAGEMENT IN DEVELOPING AND REVISING THE POLICY

III. ANNUAL TITLE I-A CAMPUS PARENT MEETINGS

Burns Elementary will hold an annual Title I meeting for parents. The meetings will be held during the fall semester. The purpose of the meeting is to provide parents with information regarding Title I-A guidelines and services offered utilizing Title I-A funds as stated in the current Family Engagement Policy. The Family Engagement Policy will also be distributed to parents. Parents will be given the opportunity to offer their suggestions for any revisions to the policy. Parents may also volunteer to serve on either the district-wide or individual school's advisory committee (SBDM) or both.

The annual Title I-A meeting will be held at flexible times to increase the opportunity for parental participation. English and Spanish translation will be available. Written notices in both languages will be sent to parents notifying them of the date and times of the meetings. Parent volunteers, parent trainers, and parent liaisons will also contact other parents by phone regarding the meetings. Volunteers who speak both English and Spanish will make all contacts.
